## GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 5, 2017

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING *TERRE HAUTE CITY CODE* CHAPTER 6, DANCE PERMIT AND CERTAIN REGULATIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council for the City of Terre Haute, Indiana, that *Terre Haute City Code* Chapter 6, is hereby amended by the insertion of the underlined text as follows:

## Sec. 4-313 Liability Insurance.

- a. The applicant shall procure, and maintain throughout the term of the permit, a policy of general premises liability insurance that names the City of Terre Haute as an "additional insured" party, and that would protect the permittee and the City from any claims that may arise out of or result from the operation of the permitted dance. The applicant shall file a certificate of insurance with the Board of Public Works & Safety before a permit can be issued.
- b. The limits of liability upon any insurance required by this Section shall in no instance be less than Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) per occurrence for injury or death of any one person and not less than Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) in any one incident, and not less than Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) for all damages arising out of injury to or destruction of property for any event in which the projected number of attendees is in excess of two hundred fifty (250) people.
- E. The limits of liability upon any insurance required by this Section may be Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) per occurrence for injury or death of any one person and not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000.000.00) in any one incident for any event in which the projected number of attendees is two hundred fifty (250) or less. The Board of Public Works and Safety may request a hearing to permit lower liability insurance requirements upon a finding that the total number of projected attendees is in question.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of the Ordinance, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of Terre Haute, Indiana and its approval by the Mayor and publication as required by law.
