

Terre Haute Transit Rules

Passengers and guests must follow all THTU rules while on transit system property or riding transit system buses. Violations may result in removal, denial of service, and/or legal consequences.

Priority Seating & Accessibility

1. Front seats are reserved for ADA-disabled passengers and the elderly.
2. Mobility devices must meet ADA guidelines and may only be secured by the driver.
3. Children must be removed from strollers while on the bus.
4. Strollers must be folded and kept out of the aisle.

Passenger Safety & Conduct

5. Passengers must never cross in front of the bus after exiting.
6. Passengers must follow all instructions from the driver and City Bus staff.
7. Animals, except for service animals, are prohibited.

Loitering & Extended Presence

8. Loitering on City Bus property or transit system property is prohibited. This includes:
 - o Remaining on the bus for more than one complete trip/run or staying at transit property for over an hour without a valid Greyhound or Miller transportation ticket.
 - o Being on transit property more than 15 minutes before services start or 15 minutes after they end.

Prohibited Items & Activities

9. The following are strictly prohibited:
 - o Open containers of food or non-alcoholic drinks (unless medically necessary).
 - o Possession of unlawful weapons or illegal substances.
 - o Damaging, defacing, or destroying transit buses, equipment, or property.
 - o Theft or attempted theft of transit system property, another rider's property, or employee belongings.
 - o Public disturbances, including obscene language, deviant behavior, threats, or abusive conduct.
 - o Offensive odors or sounds constituting a nuisance.
 - o Sleeping on transit system property.
 - o Smoking, vaping, or using tobacco products on buses or transit property.
 - o Possession of hazardous materials, including:
 - Propane or gas cylinders (except medically required oxygen).

- Liquid fuels (gasoline, kerosene, lighter fluids).
- Previously used gasoline containers.
- Liquid batteries (except for ADA mobility devices or sealed batteries like lithium-ion).
- Bulky items obstructing aisles (e.g., e-scooters, bicycles, furniture, and excessive baggage).
- Chemicals like liquid chlorine, bleach, spray paint, turpentine, and paint strippers.
- Explosives, non-legal fireworks (as defined by local/state law).

Enforcement & Rule Modifications

- THTU Management reserves exclusive rights to enforce these rules.
- Rules may be amended or modified as deemed necessary by THTU Management.

What Can You Carry When You Ride?

- Please limit your personal belongings to what you can carry in a single boarding. All carry-on items must be kept on your lap or stored at your feet in front of your seat. Personal belongings are never permitted on empty seats.
