Wabash Riverfront Master Plan

The City is collaborating closely with Riverscape, Vigo County, Thrive, and consultants on the development of the Wabash Riverfront Master Plan.

Safe Streets For All Grant

The city has recently been awarded the Safe Streets for All grant for planning and demonstration activities by the Department of Transportation. Currently, we are in the process of finalizing the grant agreement with the Federal Highway Administration. The grant funding is \$250,000.

With this grant, the city intends to develop the Terre Haute Transportation Safety Action Plan. This plan aims to enhance infrastructure, improve traffic management systems, promote education, and encourage responsible road behavior.


