• Leaves should be placed loose (not in bags) at the curbside.

• Do not place leaves near poles, mailboxes, guy wires, or any other structures.

• Do not rake leaves into the street. This blocks street drainage during rain events.

• Do not put brush or branches with the leaves as it will not be collected.

Additionally, you can put up to 10 sealed bags of leaves out with your garbage cans and Republic will pick them up, no call to 311 necessary!



The meeting was an opportunity for residents, concerned citizens, and interested parties to learn more about the ongoing cleanup project at the 19th and Beech site (formerly Colombian Enameling), as well as the health and safety measures being implemented by the EPA during the removal of hazardous materials, including asbestos.
