

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: the white cane is a symbol of mobility and independence; and

WHEREAS: the white cane serves as an extension of its user, providing assurance

that the path is safe and clear; and

WHEREAS: the confidence that assurance provides, empowers greater mobility

and independence in people with vision loss; and

WHEREAS: for those with sight, the white cane provides a vivid reminder of their

responsibility to protect the safety of individuals using it and of the

importance of protecting a pedestrian's right-of-way; and

WHEREAS: the white cane has become recognized worldwide as an essential

instrument to the safety and independence of people who are blind or

visually impaired.

NOW, THEREFORE: I, Duke A Bennett, Mayor of the City of Terre Haute, do hereby proclaim Monday, October 15, 2018 as

WHITE CANE DAY

in Terre Haute, and ask all residents to be watchful of white canes, and to protect the users' safety.
